POETS IN ORDER OF APPEARANCE

loana Lungu is a Romanian poet and spoken word artist based in Barcelona. Even though she has been writing since she was very young, Ioana started doing slam poetry only in September 2021. Since then, she has performed at various events and open mics in Barcelona and won a poetry slam competition. Ioana is working on an experimental book concept, while studying and working in totally unrelated fields. The purpose of her art is to genuinely connect with the listener, to heal and raise important social and existential questions.

Parul Mahajan is an avid spoken word poet and emcee. She is currently a third year law student at IP University, New Delhi. Parul comes from a small town Uttarakhand, India. Her writing has been published in DPS RK Puram's school magazine 'The Bubbling Cauldron'. She has also been published in Delhi Poetry Slam's electronic magazine thrice. Her writing style is tremendously influenced by contemporary poets like Rupi Kaur, Sarah Kay, Kalki Koechlin and Anna Akana. She finds inspiration in people, whose unique personal lives and circumstances are the basis of her work.

Nomfundo Khambule, South African writer and poetry/theatre performer offers most of her poems as a form of activism for Human rights. Highlighted by her performance on the TEDx stage discussing gender inequality and her performance at The Human Rights Festival at the Constitution Hill in South Africa under the topic of LGBTQIA+ rights. She has also performed at the Nelson Mandela centenary in the Eastern Cape. Nomfundo has performed in South Africa, Botswana and Nigeria and spoke on a panel in Zambia. She is inspired by the stories of black people from small communities.

The spirit of **Wayquay's** Native American Ojibwe culture is evident, both musically and lyrically, with the integration of pop, rock, and even funk. Her delivery, in a husky voice, is injected with a rap cadence, textured with traditional instruments, and layered with chants. Wayquay's music video "Navigate" won the best music video award from the American Indian Film Festival and the Native American Music Awards.

Lu Aya aka Luke Nephew (he/they/we) is the co-founder of The Peace Poets, a Hip Hop and Spoken Word crew from The Bronx that has made an indelible mark on the social movements of our times by supporting the re-emergence of the art of collective singing in protest and direct action. He is a poet, educator, emcee, musician, facilitator, and friend of the people. He has woven together the fields of art, human rights, and public health by designing programs and facilitating community building workshops for peace and justice from Ecuador to Sudan, from Afghanistan to Cuba.

Jeremy Roske is a fierce advocate for change, harnessing the power of music and poetry to help him achieve it. A founding member of the Earth Guardians, Jeremy has been touring and making music for over 25 years, consistently delivering songs and poems that uplift and inspire. His art is a soothing offering in a world of chaos. Lending a mesmerizing blend of world fusion, soul, and socially aware messages, he takes audiences on a beautiful, transformational, and utterly unforgettable journey through the most profound darkness and into a place where they can welcome love, compassion, and healing light.
