- Nazelah Jamison is a Bay Area-based performance poet, author, comedian, vocalist and emcee. Her first book of poetry, Evolutionary Heart, was released on Nomadic Press in 2016, and reprinted and re-released on Black Lawrence Press in Fall 2023. - 3. As a spoken word artist and storyteller, **Jamie DeWolf** performed on two seasons of HBO's Def Poetry Jam, premiered his play "In Spite of Everything" at the first Hip Hop Theater Festival in Moscow and was awarded "Performance of the Year" by NPR's Snap Judgment. An animated short film of his performance "The Girl in the Hallway" has won 26 international awards and was chosen by Vimeo and The Atlantic as one of the top 10 films of the year.
- 4. **Bri Blue** is a published author, motivational speaker, and Bay Area Creative Spoke Word Teaching Artist; from Berkeley, CA. Bri's passionate and emotionally-charged performances allow her to connect with audiences through empathy, relatability and inspiration. She was the Founder and Host of the weekly "Speakeasy" open mic series, and created the 'Unapologetically You' Awareness Campaign with a mission to uplift and empower women.

- 5. **Sophia Dunning** is a 6th grade Bay Area Creative student in Richmond, Ca. She writes poetry about her own life, and things she cares about.
- 6. **Myra Estrada** is an African American and Mexican female teaching artist and poet. She is the 2021 Oakland Youth Poet Laureate and has since then performed across the Bay Area in spaces such as the DeYoung Museum, Ella Baker Center, Youth Speaks, and The Oakland Public Library. She has had the honor to share space with community legends such as Black Panther Chairwoman, Elaine Brown and Co-Founder of the BLM Movement, Alicia Garza. Myra is currently studying Sociology at the University of California, Berkeley gaining knowledge on the world that surrounds her. She hopes to become a representation of the revolutionists who have walked these sacred grounds before her and the revolutionary brown babies that will come after her.
- 7. **Mike Taylor** is the Co-Founder and Executive Director of Bay Area Creative. His passion is to produce amazing arts experiences in the community, and to provide work for local performance artists. As a performer he's featured in Spoken Word shows all over the world from Berkeley, to New York, and London; writing about hope.
- 8. **Shaka Perdue** is a Bay Area Creative Hip Hop Teaching Artist. He started as a professional street dancer and competitor. He is the 2022 Yak films Life is Living Champion, and a 2024 Red Bull, Oakland qualifier champion. He has video appearances with Kendrick Lamar, Mr. Fab, E40, And many more artists.
- 9. Thaillnai is a southern born peach who was raised in the hyphy streets of Oakland California. Thaillnai is a colorful young woman promoting a positive image of black women, complimenting them in their entirety through art, dance, poetry and music. This performing artist singer-songwriter quadruples as a young visual artist, passionate about bringing awareness to the multitude of women whose voices and experience have been overlooked. With all expressions of her art, she intends to change the narrative of lost black voices.
- 10. **Papi Grande** is a multidisciplinary performance artist from Oakland California. Known for his spectacular stage presence, personality and deep themes of evolution, love and dedication. Confidence. Dynamic. Entertaining. Wavy. Expressive. Open. He/Him/Prince Papi has been striding around the community, many stages, making smiles on more than a few faces. With 2 books under his belt, he finds his place in poetry not just a grande time but a long time. His motto is "We All Had Choices," which is also the title of his first EP, check out his mixtape and ask him about its meaning.
- 11. Since 2008, **Nicole Klaymoon** has served as the founder and artistic director/executive director of the Bay Area Hip Hop Dance Theater Company Embodiment Project. She has directed and choreographed twelve original evening-length productions, including Music of the Actualized Child (2018) and the Isadora Duncan Dance Award–winning Chalk Outlines (2015). Embodiment Project wrapped up 2016 with the sold-out Seed Language, inspired by Black Lives Matter, which featured both words and in-person appearances by BLM cofounder Alicia Garza and former Black Panther leader Ericka Huggins. Nicole has been a faculty member in the Performing Arts and Social Justice department at the University of San Francisco since 2014, and has been a guest choreographer and lecturer at Arizona State University, Mills College, UC Riverside, UCLA, UC Berkeley, and Bates Dance Festival.
